The San Diego Automotive Museum is raffling off a 2021 Ford Mustang.

Proceeds of the fundraiser will benefit the museum's All Revved Up! Celebration. According to a press release, the event, to be held on Oct. 16, will kick off the museum's capital campaign to expand the current building, solidifying the auto museum as a top-tier tourist stop in Balboa Park and San Diego.

The museum recently went through many renovations including new paint, inside and out. Murals from

the 1935 California Pacific International Exposition, held in Balboa Park, now hang outside the facade of the museum, which is housed in what was once the 1935 California State Building.

The San Diego Automotive Museum opened in 1988 and is located in the heart of Balboa Park alongside the newly renovated Palisades Plaza pedestrian area. The museum displays dozens of unique cars spanning many decades and has a impressive collection of motorcycles. Museum hours are 11 a.m



The Early Birds of Southern California hosted their annual Pageant of the Thunderbird on Patriot's Day (9/11) in La Palma Park, up in Anaheim. A large show (nearly 100 cars), with judging, open to all years of Thunderbirds.

Five of our members made the drive up there: Pres. Dave Durrill, VP Bill Speer, Alan Cutsinger and Gary & Carol Noyes. Even with a lot of shady trees, it was HOT in the park: got up to 94! Sunscreen and lots of water were the order of the day.

Alan Cutsinger judged the 1957 Primary cars, while Gary Noyes and Dave Durrill judged the 55-57 Senior cars. These are the Thunderbirds that have won Gold awards in past CTCI conventions. As you might expect, these are the top restored cars. Dave and I agreed it's hard to judge and differentiate between these cars because they <u>are</u> so good and almost nothing is wrong with them – you have to get picky! But once the scores were tallied up, there was a winner. The judging sheet totaled to 110 points, including operational items (lights, horn, etc.). The top car earned 109 points (!) followed by 107 points for 2nd place. Near perfection.

They had a DJ there spinning hits from the 50s and 60s. There was a raffle, a 50:50 drawing and a small silent auction. Chilled water was provided (good thing!) and Subway sandwiches available for purchase for lunch. It was good to again see so many of the Early Bird members who cohosted the 2016 convention with our chapter.
